JUNIOR COMPETITION FEVER

We are almost halfway through our season with the Sorrento State Championships nearly upon us.

For the U11 nippers, interclub carnivals are their first taste of surf sport competition between other clubs. The Sorrento and Scarborough carnivals have already been completed, the country carnival in Bunbury is this month, 29 Jan, then it's the Trigg State qualifier on the 27 Feb and it all culminates with the State Championships at Sorrento on 19-20 March.

These interclub carnivals give the parents and kids an idea of the increased competition and logistics around this level of competition and States give the kids a taste for medals. Lifesaving is a community service and surf sport is an excellent way to get involved – competition is a means to hone your skills and compare yourselves to others. Competitions are not everyone's cup of tea, but for the younger members it's an excellent idea to ensure maximum participation in the carnivals at every level.

For some juniors this will be a time of intensive training and our club wholeheartedly supports this. For other juniors, it is a time to participate in the sport for sheer enjoyment and others to be part of a vibrant, healthy, service based community. Leading up to the state titles, training sessions already underway, will become increasingly focussed on improving the skills of the juniors and, as always, enlisting the help of parent volunteers to assist to coach or simply help organise the mechanics of these events. The recent weather has been hot and the sea calm giving us good opportunities to refine and learn new skills. The junior states run this year at Sorrento, and while there are home ground advantages, Mullaloo competitors should expect similar surf and beach conditions to our own.

The message to both the parents and youngsters is to take advantage of the training offered in all the disciplines, younger competitors are encouraged to take part in more events and not focus on specific events like the older juniors. We have fantastic facilities at our club, dedicated people who make it all work, so make sure you make the most of this as we approach one of the highlights of the season – the state championships. At the state championships, points are awarded not just for placement in events, but also for participation, so get involved. Last year Mullaloo club came third among all WA clubs, behind Trigg and Sorrento. We aim to improve this in 2011.

TED SCOTT MARATHON 2010



On December 19, Mullaloo SLSC celebrated the last Club day before Christmas with its traditional event the **Ted Scott Marathon**. The marathon was introduced by the Clubs second

president, Ted Scott in 1969 to challenge the lifesavers of the day to be able to save lives from any part of Mullaloo's patrolling coastline. Mullaloo currently patrols from Whitfords point to Ocean reef marina, a distance of 4.5km's. He created a marathon event which included a number of running and swimming sections along the patrolling coastline. Since then the race has developed into race with 9 swimming sections totalling 3km's and 5 beach running sections totalling 9 km's.

This year the conditions were fantastic and with a course set to test every individual and team, it attracted many competitors. Over 130 people entered the full Ted Scott marathon aged from 13 to 63 and all Junior age groups also participating in a modified course. This year was special as we had Ted's wife, **Evelyn Scott** travel back to Mullaloo to start the event.

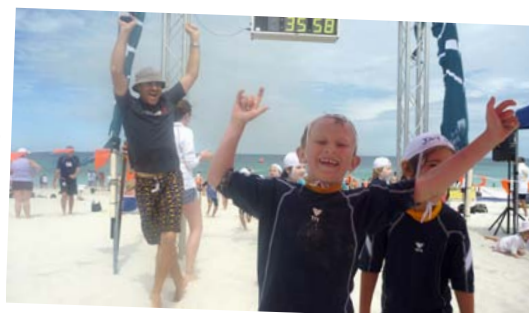
