Sunday Club Day – 9.00am

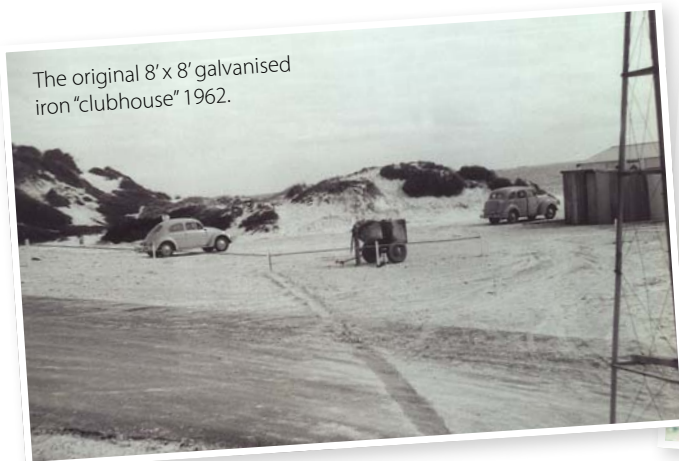
A special club day to remember our 50th Anniversary weekend.

Club BBQ – 11.00am

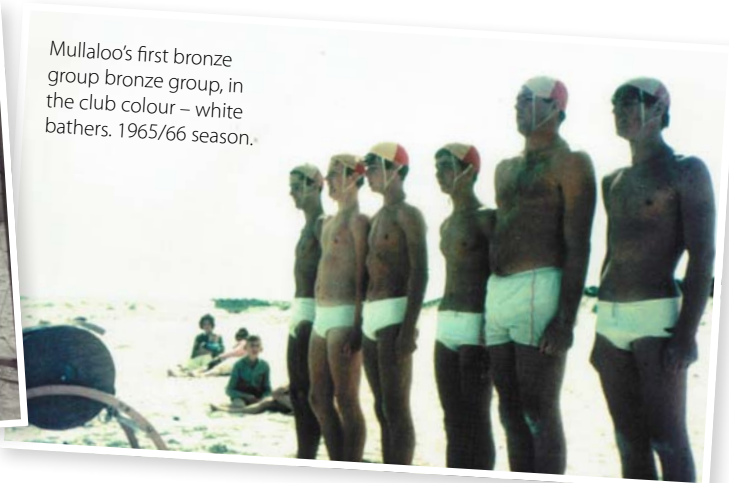
The club will be providing free sausage sizzle, hamburgers and soft drinks for all club members who are down at the beach for our Club day.

PATROL UPDATE

Please notify your patrol captain when unable to attend a Rostered Patrol to assure an appropriate number and skill mix of patrolling members is available for the patrol. Attending your rostered patrol helps in providing an even distribution of patrolling members. You can check what patrol you're on by going to the Mullaloo Surf Club website.

Patrols have been very busy since the commencement of the patrol season on 1st October 2011. There were 15 rescues for the month of October, with 14 occurring on Sunday 16th October 2011. There were also 27 first aid cases for the same period.

Thanks for a great effort. Patrols work tirelessly to maintain a safe, friendly beach environment that club members and members of the public can enjoy.

ORANA PATROL UPDATE

Junior Activities Water Safety Uniform

To assist the water safety Coordinator all water safety personnel must be clearly identified with a water safety uniform. This uniform can be either:

Water safety uniform:

- A brightly coloured orange cap secured under the chin;
- An **optional** brightly coloured rash shirt branded with 'WATER SAFETY' on the front and back of the shirt.

Patrol Uniform:

- SLSA Red and yellow quartered patrol cap; and
- SLSA patrol rash shirt branded with 'SURF RESCUE' on the front and back of the shirt.
- 'SURF RESCUE' branded wetsuits and stinger suits may also be worn where appropriate.

100% of minimum required water safety personnel are to be in the water during the activity and using SLSA approved rescue equipment whilst conducting water safety (e.g. rescue board, rescue tube).

Water Safety personnel will not be allowed to participate unless they are wearing the appropriate water safety uniform.

Patrol caps and rash shirts can be purchased at the Surf Cage.

YOUTH NEWS – KARRINYUP WALK OFF

On the 9th of October dozens of members from Mullaloo, Sorrento, Trigg and Scarborough Surf Life Saving Clubs descended on Karrinyup Shopping Centre to rattle their tins in full patrol uniform to raise money for the clubs. Volunteers from various clubs had also been fundraising on Friday and Saturday, with Sunday being the culmination of the weekend with the inter-club fashion walk-off competition, competing for prizes of monetary donations to their respective clubs.

Every team (each comprising three members) had to choose a theme for themselves, and were given a \$50 voucher to spend on their costumes in the shopping centre. They were then to pose for the audience and judges, with the most entertaining winning. Mullaloo was up first, with Damo Versace, Jo Bulley and Robert Payne – their chosen theme was Hawaiian, and they impressed the judges with a variety of cunning stunts, including hiding confetti inside a coconut and then throwing it into the air. They were followed by Sorrento, then Trigg and Scarborough, before a surprise entry from SLSWA.

Out of the teams composed of actual clubs, the Mullaloo kids impressed the judges the most, and ended up coming second to SLSWA – a good effort considering that they were easily the youngest team there. As runners-up, they won \$1,500 for the club, and the SLSWA team divided their prize money of \$2,000 evenly between the four clubs, bringing

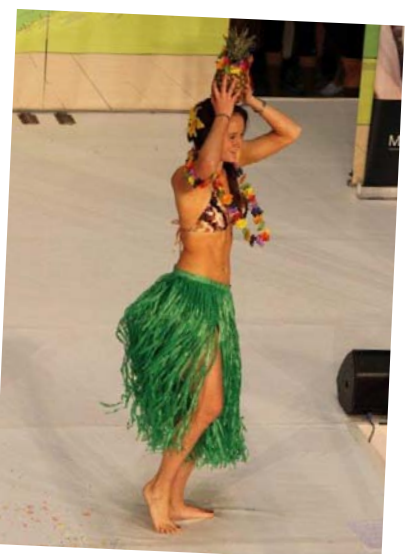
the total winnings for Mullaloo up to \$2,000. In addition, the money raised from tin-rattling over the weekend was divided between the four clubs as well.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES UPDATE

Are we all having fun yet!!!

Four weeks in and it seems that everyone is having a ball!

As the mercury starts to climb in the lead in to summer, it is a timely reminder to bring the following to club every day!

- Water Bottle (full of water!)
- Club Cap
- Hat (the one with the wide brim!)
- Rashvest or Shirt
- Footwear (as the club is a licenced venue requiring footwear and the ground gets rather hot!)
- Sunscreen

and of course ... your parents!

Just to develop that last point, we have had a number of occasions over the past few weeks where junior members have required first aid during club day – thankfully for relatively minor issues. Unfortunately when tracking down a parent or guardian we have discovered that no adult guardian is on the beach!

Please ensure that you are in attendance to cheer and join in with your child's activities during the club day and coaching sessions – and in the remote event that your child requires assistance from our diligent patroller and first aiders, that you are there to console and provide support.

ADULT SRC COURSE

The first Adult SRC course commenced in late October, however unfortunately after receiving over 30 confirmations, only 16 turned up for the on the first Monday night. As previously indicated, Water Safety is a critical element of Surf Live Saving and as such we supply the trainers and assessors to ensure compliance. Please ensure you hold up your end of the bargain and attend sessions if you have committed to them.

ALBANY CARNIVAL

A quick check of the Rose Garden Beachside Holiday Park (where we have set aside a booking for the Albany Carnival on 20 January 2012) has shown that only powered sites remain.

If you intend coming to Albany and require accommodation, please contact the Rose Garden as soon as possible indicating you are with Mullaloo SLSC to secure your place otherwise you will have to arrange accommodation separately.

BOARD DAMAGE

Whilst we have entered another 10 boards into the stock for juniors this week, unfortunately another 12 boards had to be removed for repair!

Unfortunately most of these repairs are not due to normal board use, but mishandling during collection and return of the boards to the racks during club day and coaching sessions. Each repair costs the club over \$100 and as such

we are quickly moving through our allocation of board repair funds. Not to mention that the boards are out of action for two weeks or more.

We have no choice but to bring in a policy that penalises junior members for misuse of boards which has been confirmed by the Junior Committee and advised to all Age Group Managers as follows:

Any junior member who is observed mishandling a club board by an Age Group Manager, Junior Committee Member, Coach or member of the Board of Management, where such mishandling causes damage to a board that requires the board to be removed from circulation will be restricted from using any club boards for a period of one week.

If anyone is in doubt as to correct board handling procedures please liaise with your Age Group Manager on Sunday or your Board Coach on Tuesday or Thursday.

Hopefully we don't have to enforce this rule too often.

WATER SAFETY

We now seem to have Water Safety moving as close to clockwork as the chaos of a Mullaloo Sunday will allow!

Jacqui McGregor (Patrol Captain of Orana) has now put in place a sign-on desk at the Clubhouse entrance to the beach from 9:00am to 9:30am every Sunday morning staffed by the delightful Natalie! Please ensure that you sign on every morning to ensure you are logged on surfguard.

Remember. In order to be classified as Water Safety you must ...

- Have the SRC or be Bronze Medallian qualified (and proficient)
- Have an Orange Cap
- Have a flotation device (Rescue Tube or Rescue Board)
- Be in the water!

Please ensure that you follow the directions of your Age Group Manager, Jacqui McGregor, and the IRB Crew and IRB drivers on Sunday as they have you and your children's safety foremost in their minds.

POINTS DAYS

By now most of the kids in the U11-U14 Age Groups will have nearly completed their points races, used for selection of teams to compete in the upcoming carnivals.

If you have any questions as to the methodology used for carnival team selection please discuss with your Age Group Manager or myself.

On the Beach we have also had some great early results. Zac Cundy, Josh Clarke and Callum Innes have dominated the U/17 sprints and Flags. Hayley Miller is also leading the womens U/17 sprint and Flags with some very strong efforts and Courtney Little is also placing well in the same events.

There are many more events coming up and we hope to have as many competitors participating and being a part of the group.

The next event will be the Board and Swim 2 to be held at City of Perth SLSC and the Beach Series 2 at Sorrento SLSC. The first full Senior Carnival will be held on 4th December at Scarborough SLSC and we hope to have a great contingent of competitors attending.

On Sunday 27th November the club will also be participating in the WA Pool Rescue Championships at Challenge Stadium. Last year we were very successful in the event and hope to achieve similar results. We have had a number of training sessions and if you are interested, we train on Wednesday evenings at Arena swimming Pool. Once again we are looking for participation from our swimmers and all competitors who are supported by the club.

Our Senior Club days are now going really well with our first Points day on 30th October. We had a big group of Senior club members involved in the day and it was a great for all those involved with some excellent results overall. It's fantastic to see many new faces just having a go and having fun.

BALI 2011

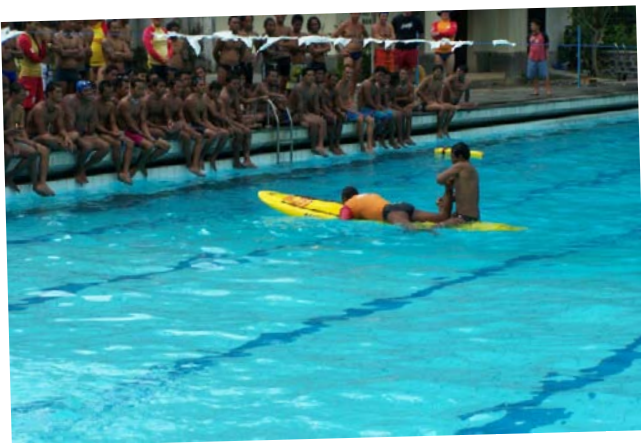

The next day she was back at work in the restaurant thanks to Mark and Dave, well done.

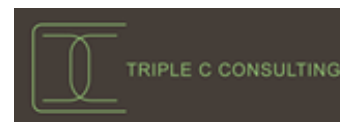
