1ST FLOOR BUILDING REFURBISHMENT UPDATE

In just one month since the last newsletter things have really moved along.

By now most of you would have heard that LotteryWest have approved our full request for funding and it is fantastic to have their support behind this project. With the backing of Surf Life Saving WA our proposal was supported and the Premiers office signed off on our funding in April.

Planning work is progressing very well. The final Building Design has been submitted and the City of Joondalup has completed their approvals. The plans have now gone to the Western Australian Planning Commission for review and approvals should be completed by the end of May. With all things going to plan, a Building license should be issued shortly after the approval.

We have now selected a preferred builder and negotiations around pricing are continuing. The Building Committee are looking to achieve as much as the fit-out as possible within the current funding limit and these negotiations are still continuing. There has always been an expectation that the Club will need further fundraising and support from its members to finish the final fitout. To date we have not asked members for additional contributions, and fundraising will be a preferred option.

The Board has also appointed a Managing Agent to secure

a commercial tenant for the Café and Kiosk and a number of people have shown interest. The Building Committee are working with the Managing Agent on discussions around a potential tenant to secure the best option for our members and the community. There is a lot of work to go in this area and we will provide further details in the near future.

As we prepare to close the building down in the first week in June, we will require a number of busy bee's to help clean out the building and store equipment, so watch out for volunteer requests for assistance. We need your help!

As I mentioned above, we will be closing the Club Lounge for the last time and we move to a new location within the Building. We will have a bit of an event and reminisce about the functions and celebrations that have occurred over the last 14 years, since the last refurbishment. We will advertise something in the future when we have a firm date.

For now, that is all the news. Once we have our plans approved, we will share the details with you.

Please note that there will be some office closures as we prepare for the refurbishment to commence. Please watch your emails and our facebook page to keep up to date with office availability times.

SURF SPORTS WRAP - AUSSIES 2016!

So, after getting used to the sun rising over the ocean... wow! What a week of competition – the pinnacle of a season's or more effort and commitment. Our touring party was split over two groups – the Youth with 7 competitors and the Seniors/ Masters with 27 competitors (includes reel holders and march past).

The surf threw challenging conditions every day, a long sweep, massive under current and some wave heights that left more than one or two heart beats on hold.

Our Youth competitors all making their debut at this 2nd Youth Australian Championship with some events not previously contested by our Club in the respective age group and enough competitors to make some rather competitive teams! Without doubt the highlight of the two days was the 2km beach run. A late afternoon event had Ryley Gardener fist pump his way to a GOLD medal in the u14 and Ben Hillen 'cruised' (well he looked so cool and calm about it) in with a SILVER medal in the u15 – absolute champions! In the water our youth proved surf conditions were not going to hold them back and highlight efforts with several finals being made go to Kane Smith in his u15 surf race, Ryley Gardener in his u14 board race and then both teaming it up with Cooper Schulz and Ben Hillen to make finals in the Cameron and board relays.



Our few masters – all female I might add and two of them making their debut (Jenni Wood and Gayle Gould) at a



Masters Australian Championship held on tight – no, literally, to their craft amid the myriad of pot holes and carnage that lay in each race. Our seasoned competitor Mandy Lee coming away with a national silver and bronze medal but unfortunately not pot hole proof – was legitimately saved in her board rescue race on her way out to swim (a break in her foot!). We knew Mandy was not going to be out without a fight and with boot and crutches in tow was a fantastic

mascot for the team as the week progressed. Without saying the injuries did not stop there, clubbie (although competing for Byron Bay) Jeff Vidler also victim to the pot holes tore is Achilles at the masters meet. We wish these not so good patients (rest, what rest!) – speedy recoveries.

Our senior competitors tasked with numerous events in equally challenging conditions held their own. Outstanding success for Owen Vorster with a GOLD in the u17 2km beach run having lead the whole way. Special mention of Jose Desfosses for his last minute warm up and pep talk. Fantastic performances from Callan Smith tackling the open surf race (Eckstein, Day... just sayin') along with his u17 age group and competing up in the u19s to assist teams – three finals to boast, Wes Gould in making three finals two of which in the top 10 and in his pet event board racing – great goal tick, Ben Jones making two finals, Paige Wood achieving her goal of single ski final, Tayla Tenaglia finalist in the Champion Lifesaver – all day event!

Aussies first timer Soraya Lee had a big program and I'm sure we'll be seeing this name here again in the future. Brett Gould tackling his first year in opens and wow what an opportunity to be able to race against the best in the country. Harry Jones also debuted in the open championships this year and having a go in the conditions with a ski. Kelsey Roberts had a job of competing whilst trying to maintain composure as her sister Jaime (Mullaloo member competing for Newport) made it through several rounds to win GOLD in the female double ski. Well done Jaime, was a great race!

Our only surf boat crew – Pirates had a great few days of racing, some excellent swell conditions and a thirst for more. A big thanks to the guys for pulling together literally a day before competition putting all the fixings e.g seats, footchocks yes, it was a brand new boat fresh off the blocks. Well done team!! Thanks Tim McFarlane also as the WA representative for the surf boat panel during the championships.

I'm sure you'll agree when you view the list further on, showing all our competitors race pathways, it has been a great journey!

A huge shout of appreciation to our invaluable support crew of parents who settled in quite quickly to everything from proxy waiting, team briefing, marshalling calls, handling, water bearers, jacket holders, food preparers, instant cheer squad, craft carriers (now yes, the competitors did most of the carting, but I kid you not, the container was two blocks away from the beach and there were quite a few of us that ran the gauntlet with a double ski or reel – oh yes, feeling the fitness there!) and of course all our 'fine' wearers (some things best left unsaid!).
